

Dr Sullivan is a Distinguished Professor in the Departments of Genetics and Psychiatry at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He was also a Professor in the Department of Medical Epidemiology and Biostatistics at the Karolinska Institute in Stockholm, Sweden from 2014-2024. He received his MD from the University of California, San Francisco in 1988 and completed a psychiatric residency at the University of Pittsburgh and obtained Fellowship in the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Psychiatrists. After five years in Christchurch, New Zealand, he moved back to the US in 1996 to work in the genetic epidemiology group of Dr Ken Kendler at Virginia Commonwealth University. In 2003, Dr Sullivan moved to the Department of Genetics at UNC-Chapel Hill. His labs investigate the molecular genetics, functional genomics, and pharmacogenomics of schizophrenia, major depressive disorder, and eating disorders. He has been a professional bioinformatician and analyst for 4 decades. He co-founded and leads multiple consortia principally the Psychiatric Genomics Consortium. His partner in life and work is Prof Cynthia Bulik, a noted expert in eating disorders.
