Heidi Beate Bentzen is specialized in data protection law, biotechnology law, and research ethics. She researches and teaches the legal and ethical aspects of emerging technologies and large-scale data sharing and reuse, within and across contexts and jurisdictions. She is Ethics Advisor to several of the largest medical/life science research and health and genetic data infrastructure projects in Europe.

Bentzen was a member of the United Nations Special Rapporteur on the Right to Privacy's health data task force, part of drafting the global *Recommendation on the protection and use of health-related data*. Bentzen was furthermore a member of the working group led by the Norwegian Ministry of Education and Research to establish a collaboration on Artificial Intelligence on a national level between Norway and the United States, and she was a Working Group Member contributing to the ALLEA, EASAC, FEAM report on International Sharing of Personal Health Data for Research. She provides legal advice on international data transfers to the Norwegian Institute of Public Health.

Bentzen evaluates proposals for the European Commission and the Dam Foundation, and conducts ethics reviews for the European Commission, Eureka, and a Norwegian Regional Ethics Committee.
