

Mette Hartlev – brief bio

Mette Hartlev is Professor of Health Law at the Faculty of Law, University of Copenhagen. She received her PhD (1993) and LL.D. (2006) from the University of Copenhagen. She is currently the chair of the Danish National Committee of Research Ethics in Health Sciences and co-editor of the European Journal of Health Law. The focus of her research interest is patients' rights, health and human rights, health technologies, law, science and technology studies, data protection law, biobank regulation and welfare law. Most of her research is inspired – substantially and methodologically – by interdisciplinary collaboration, and she has been involved in several international and national interdisciplinary research projects exploring ethical, legal, and social aspects of new health technologies, including personalized medicine and development and use of AI in the health care services. Currently, she is partner in the Horizon Europe funded project WISDOM (wisdomhorizon.eu) aiming at developing AI-based models for risk prediction and disease trajectories for patients with chronic immune-mediated diseases (especially Multiple Sclerosis) and their relatives – and to validate such tools not only on the technical and clinical parameter but also from a user – patient and clinician – perspective.
