The conference focuses on how Nordic strengths in biobanks, health data, genomics, AI, and precision medicine can be leveraged to improve future healthcare. A central objective is to use large-scale health and population data responsibly to accelerate

biomedical research, support clinical decision-making, and enable more personalised prevention, diagnosis, and treatment while maintaining public trust, transparency, and strong governance.

Nordic Biobank x NVIDIA Federated Learning Hackathon for Biomedical Applications

As a practical extension of the conference, the [Nordic Biobank x NVIDIA Federated Learning Hackathon for Biomedical Applications](#) will take place at Rigshospitalet, Copenhagen University Hospital, from 16–18 September 2026. The hackathon is closely aligned with the conference themes of biobanks, multimodal health data, AI, and precision medicine.

The hackathon will explore and develop new analytical approaches based on federated learning and privacy-preserving analytics, enabling researchers to collaborate across institutions and countries without moving sensitive patient-level data. Participants will work in interdisciplinary teams to develop secure cross-biobank analytical workflows, investigate data harmonisation strategies, and apply advanced machine learning methods to real-world biomedical research challenges using Nordic health data resources. All projects will follow open science principles, with methods and outcomes intended for public sharing and future scientific development. Participation is free of charge and subject to application and selection. The hackathon is organised by:
